What you can do:

Take yourself or your dog for a walk and make a difference -

- Take a bucket/bag/container and pick up plastic & other litter/rubbish/ trash before it becomes ocean pollution. Every bit counts!
- · Choose a site your street, local park or beach - and 'adopt' it. Commit to cleaning it on a regular basis by picking up rubbish & dealing with it correctly (recycling whatever you can). You will see the difference this regular, small act makes in your community & can feel good about every single thing you collect **not** finding its way into the sea.
- Remember, all waterways lead to the ocean, this includes rivers, creeks and, of course, stormwater drains. Roads often lead to the ocean, too.

Plastic's effect on coral reefs

- 1. When plastic comes into contact with coral, the likelihood of disease rises from 4% to 90% as disease-carrying microbes colonise plastic waste!
- 2. A recent study of more than 150 reefs across the Asia-Pacific region showed more than 11.1 billion plastic items are currently entangled on those coral reefs!
- 3. Plastic & other ocean pollution stresses coral through light deprivation, toxin release & disease.
